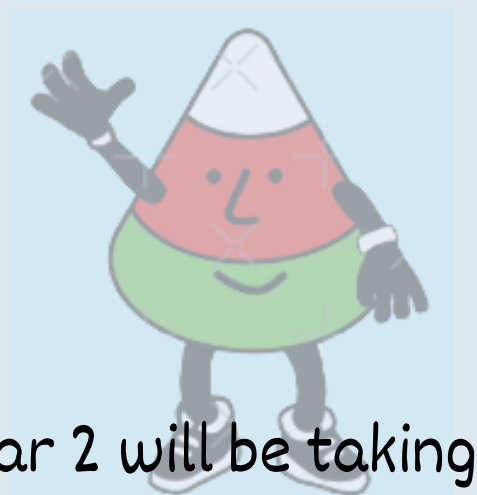
Please can I remind you to be mindful about where you are parking - our residents are very important to our school community so please be respectful.

Remember that the children can dress in their traditional Welsh costumes, Welsh rugby and football shirts, or red white and green clothes.

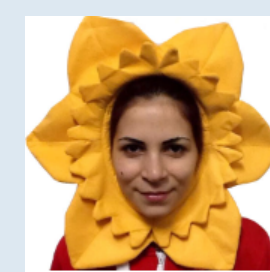
